Economic Impact

Exchange programs strengthen the U.S. economy by...

- Exchange visitors bring resources to U.S. communities (in program dollars, visitors spending cash, and connections for local businesses/individuals). It is estimated that the Summer Work Travel (SWT) program alone contributes more than \$500 million to the U.S. economy each year.
- SWT operates at no cost to U.S. taxpayers; participants pay fees that cover the costs associated with oversight and administration of the program.
- SWT supplements local workforces in areas with small year-round populations, which enables businesses to stay open longer and at greater scale.
- National Export Strategy report includes international education as a topic export priority for the first time.
 - "In 2022, the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis reported that U.S. exports of education-related travel totaled \$37.68 billion, a 17% increase from previous year."
